## Editorial: freedom and happiness

Last weekend there was the VALTI festival in Amsterdam.

The theme was: "It's a religion" and **freedom** was the catch cry.

Lots of music from bands like the: "The Holy Mobile trinity" - "Zorba the Buddha" - "Blessed sea devil" - "Voo-Didgeri-DooDoo" - "Wodan" - "Abracadabraham and his seven goats" and many other inventive names.



It was hard to find a picture which was fit to put into this article.

So where does it come from?

### Valti

The Roman word 'Valens' has been used both as a locational name as in the Spanish city of Valencia, and as a pre-medieval baptismal name such as Valente or Valentin.

Perhaps not surprisingly there are estimated to be at least forty surname spellings, which have developed from 'valens'. These include Valenti (Portuguese and Spanish), Vallentin (French), Valentine (English), Faltin and Foltin (German), Walenta and Walesa (Polish), Balint (Hungarian), Velte (Czech), and many others.

In fact there is not a country in Europe which does not have some form of this popular name.

It is said that this derives from a pre 3rd century saint and martyr Valentinus, whose martyrdom happened on February 14th, which in the old Roman calendar marked the coming of spring.

So, mankind keeps busy.

In Rotterdam there are weekend festivals all throughout the summer.

A while ago I found an interesting definition of Busy-ness.. as follows: "The state of constant distractions that allows people to avoid difficult realities and maintain a state of self deception."

With the help of cell phones, news services and social web-working, this has become easier than ever.

Quote: "We are constantly distracted and engulfed by the technologies we've created ourselves and by the constant barrage of so-called information that comes our way that keeping busy AND AVOIDING REALITY is now a way of life." Somehow this is seen as freedom and the way to happiness.

Another quote I came across: "No one is freer than a person with no moral beliefs."

From the USA came the following:

"If we are going to be elevating freedom to the defining principle of what we're about as a culture and a nation, (USA) we ought to take a careful look at what freedom in practice brings."

**"The weird thing about freedom is that it doesn't bring happiness."**

Too much freedom is a dangerously, empty thing.

After all, energy companies are **free** to ravage and poison nature, when people divorce, they are free, but it's a freedom they sometimes do almost anything for to avoid.

Some people have the freedom, every day, to figure out some decent and satisfying way to live, and yet all they ever get, for all their choices and all their freedom, is more unhappiness.

So, how do we find happiness?

**The way to happiness** is surrendering individual freedom voluntary, to have convictions and spend our time acting on those convictions.

Not surprisingly, this is what the Bible teaches! The words of Jesus: *John 8:30 As he spake these words, many believed on him.*

*31 Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; 32 And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.*

The "believing" bit is the conviction and the "continuing" bit is the acting on these convictions.

The word "free" as a promise means the following: *to liberate, to exempt from mortal liability, deliver, make free.*

Not bad.

Another Bible concept is peace.

This is something **between** freedom and happiness, it connects the two as it were.

The words of Jesus again:

*John 14:26 But the Comforter, [which is] the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things,*

*and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you.*

*27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.*

Also, in the words of Solomon, king of Israel:

*Ecclesiastes 12: 13 Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man.*

*14 For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil.*

Conclusion:

Surrendering individual "freedom" to the conviction of the Gospel, acting upon this conviction and



avoiding distractions is the only way to true happiness.

It is not in freedom from duty but freedom to pursue your conviction.

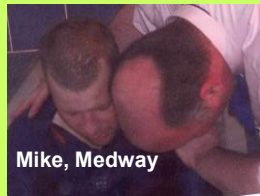

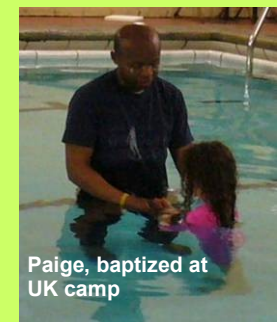

## Rotterdam

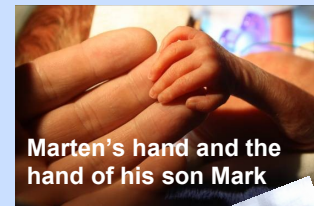

After talking further with brother Rob, she was baptized. We had an encouraging time in Kupang where we also did a lot of outreach.

We then travelled to the village where sister Caroline (from Holland) used to live. We met her niece who had been suffering from stomach complaints and migraines for several years. Her mother asked if we could pray for her, so we laid hands and prayed and she was instantly healed. Caroline met an old friend, Malachi, who had suffered a stroke 15 years ago. Ps Teddy and Jacob prayed for him. He travelled back with us to Bali and on the way his right leg, which was partially paralyzed for 15 years, was healed. He came to the meeting that Sunday and the following day he asked us if we would pray for him for him to receive the Holy Spirit. After praying for a few minutes, he received the Holy Spirit and spoke in tongues. Later that day Pastor William baptized him and God also healed his speech impediment. Our trip to Bali was a huge blessing because we learned a lot from the brothers and sisters.
